Rising Voices

A glimpse into award-winning research and teaching



Each year, the Faculty of Social Sciences awards the **sowi:doc Awards** to selected doctoral graduates. The Award winners receive EUR 1,500 each for their outstanding research contributions in the framework of their doctoral thesis. The Award aims at motivating doctoral graduates to pursue a career in academia. An interdisciplinary expert committee, appointed by the head of the Faculty, is responsible for making the final award decision.

With the establishment of the Vienna Doctoral School of Social Sciences in 2020, the sowi:doc Awards that the Faculty has established in 2018 have been linked to the Doctoral School.

For the first time, the Faculty of Social Sciences is presenting the **Univie Teaching Award Social Sciences**. With this award, the Faculty makes commitment to teaching visible and recognises outstanding teaching. A total of three teaching awards are presented to individual lecturers or teaching teams for courses already held. Students, student representatives, tutors, lecturers and teaching staff were invited to nominate courses that they consider to be outstanding. Self-nominations were possible.

This year, the award is presented in two categories "Successfully researching social phenomena" (1 prize) and "Innovative and interactive teaching methods – Young Talent Award" (2 prizes). The award winners receive EUR 3,000 (gross) each for their outstanding teaching.
